

## Faculty Funding Support

The Vice-Chancellor makes funds available to Faculties to directly support the research work undertaken by enrolled research candidates. An annual financial allocation is made and the amount calculated is based on the number of in-time research candidates. In-time means those who are funded under the Research Training Scheme and who have not completed the equivalent of four years of full-time study for a PhD and two years of full-time study for a Masters by research degree.

Each Faculty has responsibility for the distribution of this funding and a report on the distribution will be presented to the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research) at the end of the year. Each Faculty is to provide financial support for the costs incurred in actually undertaking the research required for degree completion. In some cases this may cover the costs of chemical and equipment purchase and use and in others, it may cover costs associated with accessing rare documents, provision of photocopying or printing requirements; purchase of software or other required materials. Funding access is generally by way of an application with supporting evidence required for the amount requested.

Faculties generally set a financial limit on the amount available each year. The information from Faculties and their departments about the financial support provided to their enrolled candidates is available on the various Faculty websites.
